Description of Minor Modifications and Rationale

These proposed changes will give our students more options for BFA Strategy courses, and better prepare them to begin their careers in industry.

In 2018 we successfully wrote two new courses: COMD 3533 Special Topics in Illustration and COMD 3633 Advanced Strategies in Illustration which were approved unanimously by the department and then approved by College Council. These courses were initially offered in Fall 2018. The proposed changes to course descriptions now allow students to take these courses twice.

In Spring 2020 COMD 3508 Intro To Game Design was moved to MTEC. it became clear we needed additional options for our Illustration students within the new COMD BFA Strategy

curricular structure. By moving COMD 3513 Narrative Illustration to be a strategy course we are helping to fill that gap.

Updating the prerequisite of COMD3652 Web Design III – Design Studio and COMD3663 Dynamic Web I: Web 2.0 will allow students to take the class at the start of junior year. Students are prepared for these courses by the topics covered in COMD2451 Web Design I.

In addition to the above course changes, there is an update to the Degree Requirements. This is noted under the curricular table. It's important to note that COMD3505 Special Topics in Graphic Design, COMD 3533 Special Topics in Illustration and COMD 3633 Advanced Strategies in Illustration were written with ENT 3320 as precedent: these courses all have revolving topics and students can take them twice. Therefore, the STRATEGY Requirements changes from *Choose any 3 courses for 9 credits* to *Choose any 9 credits* and the SKILLS Requirements changes from *Choose any 4 courses for 12 credits* to *Choose any 12 credits*.
