A. Sending and Receiving Institutions

Sending College: Kingsborough Community College (KCC)
Department: Department of Health, Physical Education & Recreation
Program: Community Health, Health Services Administration Concentration
Degree: Associate in Science

Receiving College: New York City College of Technology (NYCCT)
Department: School of Professional Studies
Program: Health Services Administration (HSA)
Degree: Bachelor of Science

B. Admission Requirements for Bachelor of Science in Health Services Administration:

An associate degree in a health science program of study with a minimum grade point average of 2.5, and appropriate Licensure or Certification in hand or pending;
OR
An associate degree from a program that has an articulation agreement with the NYCCT HSA program with a minimum grade point average of 2.5;
OR
An associate degree with a minimum grade point average of 2.5, and at least five years of alternative work experience in a health care setting or related field as determined by the HSA program coordinator.

C. Transfer Credits Awarded

Articulation with the Community Health Program, (Health Administration Concentration) at Kingsborough Community College with the New York City College of Technology's Bachelor of Science in Health Services Administration is based upon the following transfer of credits:

E. Articulation Agreement Follow-up Procedures

1. Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating this agreement:

When either of the programs undergo any changes, this articulation agreement will be reviewed and revised as necessary by a departmental representative, selected by their respective Chairpersons, to represent them.

2. Procedures for evaluating agreement (i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success):

Upon the request of the Kingsborough Community College (KCC), each year New York City College of Technology will provide the following information: a) the number of KCC students who enrolled to the program; b) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students at NYCCT

At the end of each semester the various representatives of each institution will review the performance of the transfer students to determine if adjustments to, or termination of the articulation agreement is warranted.

3. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing the agreement (e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, websites, etc.):

- This articulation agreement will be publicized on the New York City College of Technology website, and the Kingsborough Community College website.
- Transfer advisors at KCC will promote this agreement with eligible students.
