CUNY BA AND CITY TECH AFR:

Enrolled CUNY BA students pursuing degrees in Legal Studies, Political Science, History, Psychology, or other areas within the Social Sciences or Professional Studies are likely to find the course offerings within the AFR Option appealing, as they not only grant students a unique learning experience, but, also, lead to career fields in law, politics, journalism, social work, anthropology, the arts, academia, medicine, among other career fields.

CUNY BA students who opt into the AFR Option will be required to take all 12 credits toward the completion of their CUNY BA degree. Additional information about forthcoming Articulation Agreements with other CUNY colleges can be found on the AFR department website.

A FINAL WORD ON THE AFR OPTION:

Beyond being interdisciplinary, several courses within the AFR Option are writing intensive (WI), and, in many cases, they are also reading intensive (RI). Students will often be asked to develop individual or group classroom presentations. They will be exposed to various forms of research methodology and will be expected to use their personal, cultural, and scholarly expertise to engage in creative and enthusiastic classroom discussions. The Option's desire is to create a community of thinkers who are able to fully articulate their understanding of Diasporic Studies, as it relates to the discipline of African American Studies, and go on to positively impact and contribute to the cultural communities they learn about.

Students interested in enrolling within the Option in African American Studies must meet with the AFR Department Chair, the Director of Liberal Arts & Sciences/CUNY BA Director (616 P), or the Dean of Arts & Sciences (321 N).

OPTION IN AFRICAN AMERICAN STUDIES





ABOUT THE DEPARTMENT:

The Department of African American Studies offers traditional and interdisciplinary academic courses in the Arts (music/ dance/visual arts), Literature (African/African American/ Afro-Caribbean), and the Social Sciences (Anthropology and History). Beyond the traditional lecture-based classroom instruction, AFR courses also utilize the place-based learning module. As such, students attend field trips to New York City Museums, the United Nations, the African Burial Grounds, The National Black Theater, and New York City Hip Hop archives and landmarks. Interdisciplinary courses also expose students to guest lecturers over the course of a given semester.

A School of Liberal Arts & Sciences program, the Department's primary goal is to bring into focus—through its intellectual, varied, and unique course offerings—the study of the peoples of the African Diaspora and their historical and cultural contributions from the antiquity to the present.

THE FACULTY:

Our courses are taught by fulltime professors and adjunct lecturers. Not only are they Master Teachers in the classroom, but, also, the faculty is comprised of distinguished academic scholars (anthropology/history/literature), visual artists and art historians, and ethnomusicologists and musicians.

WHAT IS AN OPTION, AND IS IT RIGHT FOR YOU?:

An Option is an opportunity for a student to participate in focused or concentrated academic study within another discipline/department BEYOND the major. In short, it is the equivalent of a minor; this is an excellent opportunity for a student to gain exposure to another course of study. Having an Option serves several purposes:

- Students gain an opportunity to challenge themselves.
- Options feed additional academic interests held by students.
- Option courses prepare students for studies beyond the undergraduate degree: Associate or Baccalaureate.
- Option courses articulated with Baccalaureate programs within CUNY are transferable.

THE AFR OPTION:

The Option in African American Studies is **12** credits.

The courses, all Pathways approved, are a condensed academic lens into the overall AFR curriculum. Therefore, students may choose a focus that centers on the arts, literature and the social sciences. Of the 12 credits to satisfy the option, no more than two courses may be taken in the same discipline (e.g. History or Sociology)

In order to satisfy the requirements for the Option, students must chose **3** courses from the following list:
