

FEDERAL TITLE IV FINANCIAL AID ELIGIBILITY APPEAL

In accordance with Federal Title IV regulations, students may appeal their ineligibility for Federal Title IV funds by submitting a written appeal with supporting documentation to the College Committee on Financial Aid Standing.

Appeals will be evaluated to determine if events beyond a student's control, such as personal illness, death or severe illness of an immediate family member, or other extenuating circumstances contributed to the student's failure to meet academic standards. Additionally, the student's academic history will be considered to determine if there is a reasonable expectation that the student can meet the standard.

If the appeal is denied, the student may continue at the College without Federal financial assistance. After one semester, at the request of the student, the record will be re-examined to determine if courses successfully completed have restored Federal Title IV eligibility.

Instructions for Appeal

1. Ensure that you are enrolled for the semester in which you are appealing. For example, if you are appealing to receive aid for FALL semester, you must be enrolled in the classes for that semester. You may not appeal to receive aid for *previous* semesters. For example, if you were enrolled in SPRING semester, you may not appeal in FALL semester to receive aid for the previous SPRING semester.
2. In order to appeal the denial of your continued financial aid eligibility resulting from failure to comply with Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) standards, you must complete a Title IV or SAP Appeal Form, and submit ALL required supporting documentation. Appeals submitted without all required documentation will be regarded as incomplete and denied. The following must be submitted as part of the appeal:
 - **Explanation of extenuating circumstances why you did not meet SAP Standards.** Your written statement must include a description of the problem/incident indicating dates and time periods involved, as well as the impact on your academic performance.
 - **Explanation of what has changed to allow you to meet Satisfactory Academic Progress.**
 - **Appropriate documentation supporting your appeal.** Documentation may include, but is not limited to, divorce decrees, death certificates, birth certificates, letters from doctors, counselors, advisors, report of incident/s, such as a police report, insurance damage report, and bill/s for services related to emergency, obituary, etc. Written statements from professionals (e.g. clergy, employers, medical professionals, etc.) who can verify your extenuating circumstances should reference your name, dates of visits/treatments, and any other information pertinent to your appeal circumstances. Any statements from professionals listed above or other third party persons must be on company letterhead. NOTE: Lack of documentation may result in the denial of your appeal.

Select the **2021-2022 Title IV Financial Aid Eligibility Appeal** under the City Tech ID Forms OR the Guest Account Forms (choose the form based on the kind of account you created). If you are unable to login to Dynamic Forms, you can submit this form via email to **StudentAffairs@citytech.cuny.edu**. Please note that submissions through email may be delayed.
4. Complete appeals will be reviewed in a timely manner, usually 7-10 business days. During peak periods, your appeal may take longer to be processed. You will be notified of the outcome of your appeal via your City Tech email.

****Please note** that incomplete appeals and requests for documentation will cause delays. Please plan accordingly.
