

Fall, 2017 Analysis of Student Success in Human Service Courses:

Associate Courses:

Health Courses: Community Health (HEA 1102) and Women's Health Issues (HEA 2108, now code 1108)

Two health courses, or multiple sections, were offered in fall 2017. Most of the students passed the course with most receiving an A or B grade. In total, 1.6 % failed the course and 3.4 achieved a D; therefore, these students are required to repeat the course for a minimum of a C grade.

HUS 1101 Introduction to Human Services.

90% completed the course in one section there were a number of students who did not achieve a C or better, due to not submitting assignments. Most students obtained within the A-B grade range.

HUS 1201 Elements of Counseling

There were three sections and in one section only 78% completed the course. Of these that remained, 95.2 completed the course with a C or better. Most received an A or B grade.

HUS 1202 Community Mental Health

This course was a 100% success of students passing with a C or better grade. Most of the grades were in the B range.

HUS 1203 Human Service Seminar

A high rate passed the class with a "C or Better, with most students obtaining a A grade

HUS 1206 Group Dynamics

In this course two sections had 100% with a C or better grade with one section only having 88.9%. 11.1 student received a 'D'

HUS 2305 Field Practicum I

For this first Field Practicum Course, 10% of the students failed to make a C grade thus, they will repeat the course. Not submitting hours, assignments were the reason. But there were two sections that did have 100% completed.

HUS 2307 Community Organization

Students were very successful in this course as 98.2 completed the course with a C or better grade.

HUS 2405 Field Practicum II

Out of the four sections offered a high percentage completed the course successfully (98.6%), It appears that 1.4% need to repeat the course.

Despite it being less than 10%, concerns for students not completing the course, either by dropping the course, or not achieving a 'C' or better grade, is for HUS 1101 Introduction to HUS; HUS 1206 Group Dynamics and HUS 2305/2405 Field Practicum I & II. Emphasis on students submitting work on time appears to be the issue for these students. All other associate level courses proved to be successful for students in terms of grading (C or better) and completion of course(s).
