Academic Minor: **GENERAL DESCRIPTION**

- An academic minor is a path of study designed to enable students to pursue a second field of specialization.
- Academic minors are intended to officially recognize students' attainment of knowledge in more than one academic field and to encourage students' goals of broadening their education across academic disciplines.

Academic Minor: **REQUIREMENTS**

- An academic minor requires a minimum of 12 credit hours. Academic minor requirements must be completed with a 2.0 grade point average or higher
- All courses must be completed with a grade of C or higher
- At least 50 percent of these credits must be taken at the college
- Students are encouraged to declare an academic minor no later than successful completion of 60 credits

Academic Minor: **STEPS**

- Students must declare an academic minor by completing the [Declaration of Academic Minor Form](#) and submitting this form to the registrar.
- Students filing for graduation must consult with the minor coordinator or chair, complete the [Validation of the Academic Minor form](#)

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Spanish Language

- **The minor in Spanish Language can be completed in all BS degrees and most BTech degrees within the required**
- The academic minor in Spanish Language is available to students in **academic major programs with 12 or more credits available in General Education Flexible Common Core and College Option Requirements.** **The program is designed to provide students with a better understanding of Spanish language and culture to enhance their skills in their professions and augment their career opportunities in the country's multilingual settings and in other parts of the world.** This program would be beneficial to individuals interested in studying Spanish as a foreign language and to heritage speakers of Spanish who have prior knowledge of the language. This academic minor consists of two to four required courses (depending on the course in which students were placed during the placement test process) and two additional courses selection of three electives focused on Health (SPA 2203) and Literature (SPA 3301, SPA 3302).

Hispanic Studies

- **The minor in Hispanic Studies can be completed in all BS degrees and most BTech degrees within the required**
- The academic minor in Hispanic Studies is available to students in academic major programs with 12 or more credits available in General Education Flexible Common Core and College Option Requirements. The program aims to provide students with an in-depth comprehension of the existing diverse cultures and languages (Spanish, Quechua, Guaraní, Aymara, Nahuatl, etc.) in the 21 Hispanic countries, as well as of the different dialects of Spanish. Aside from mastering an intermediate or advanced level in Spanish, students will use their cognitive, communicative, and cultural skills in language learning and analysis. Students will delve deeper into social practices and traditions, such as history, music, arts, and literature.
- **This is an ideal academic minor for those students who, regardless of their proficiency level, would like to learn more about the Hispanic language, literature, and culture.** Students have the option to start the degree at 1102), Intermediate (SPA 2201, SPA 2201HS, SPA 2202, SPA 202HS), or Advanced (SPA 3301 or SPA 3302) level. The elective courses covering these cultural areas will be taught in English.
