

## City Tech Healthcare Policy & Management/School of Public Health 4+1 BS+MPH/MS

### Deadlines:

**Spring:** January 1<sup>st</sup>

**Summer:** May 1<sup>st</sup>

**Fall:** August 1<sup>st</sup>

City Tech students enrolled in the BS in Healthcare Policy and Management program and who successfully complete the 4+1 Program's application process at the School of Public Health (SPH) can take graduate level courses during their junior and senior years at City Tech, with these courses counting towards **both** their undergraduate and graduate degrees. Undergraduate tuition is paid until the 120 credits needed for the bachelor's degree are completed. The BS and MPH/MS degrees can be completed in five years rather than six, saving both time and money.

The [agreement](#) between City Tech and the CUNY Graduate School of Public Health and Health Policy allows qualified students with a GPA of 3.0 or above the opportunity to take three to twelve (3-12) credits of graduate level courses during their junior and senior years at City Tech, and obtain early admission to an SPH Master of Public Health or Master of Science program.

### 4+1 Program Eligibility Criteria:

- Approximately 75 credits completed at City Tech
- Cumulative undergraduate GPA of 3.0 at City Tech (undergraduate)

### Final SPH Acceptance Criteria (admission to CUNY SPH):

- Have a minimum of 12 credits of SPH coursework.
- Maintain a GPA of 3.0 or higher for both cumulative and SPH-specific coursework.
- Earn a bachelor's degree.
