TEACHING ASSISTANT CHILD CARE CERTIFICATE PROGRAM TAP100

Tues, 6 - 9 pm , Sat, 10 am - 2 pm, 2/15- 6/6 160 hours, \$1065

An integrated program for adults in transition to new careers working with children. Students are prepared for employment in both daycare and in school settings. The program includes 100 hours of classroom instruction and a sixty-hour supervised observational practicum in a childcare or educational organization. Classroom instruction includes six hours of test review for the New York State Assessment of Teaching Skills Test (NYSATAS). During the course of the program, the student will complete workshops and receive certificates in Child Abuse, School Violence Prevention & Intervention, CPR, and DASA (Bullying).

Additional Expenses: Students may have to purchase approximately \$100 in books and supplies. Some internships may require a fingerprinting fee. There is limited space available in this popular program. Enroll early!

The Assessment of Teaching Assistant Skills (ATAS) is now part of the New York State Teacher Certification Examinations (NYSTCE). The purpose of this test is to help ensure that certified teaching assistants have the knowledge and skills that are important for the job of a teaching assistant in New York State's public schools. The ATAS is a 100 question computer based test lasting 3 hours at given designated sites by appointment. This is a preparatory course for individuals interested in taking the NYSATAS exam. The course will review the core areas of NYSATAS (reading, writing, math and instructional support) and provide analysis of questions that have been presented in previous exams.

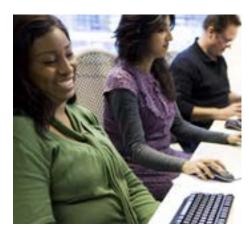

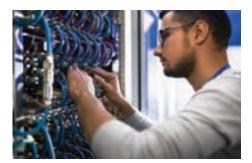



INTRO TO HTML AND CSS FOR WEB DEVELOPMENT CRS 107

Tues, Thurs, 6 - 9 pm, 1/21 - 1/30 12 hours, \$375

This course introduces HTML and CSS, the fundamental building blocks of web design. Participants will create a small website with menu links, styled text, images, and embedded media. Covers block vs inline tags, embedding media, style sheets, and layout control.

This course is strongly recommended for those with no web development experience who plan to enroll in CRS 200 FullStack.

FULL-STACK WEB DEVELOPMENT 16-WEEK INTENSIVE CRS 200

Full Stack Web Development is a 16-week, 96hour class focusing on Front End programming languages including HTML, CSS, Javascript, and jQuery along with BackEnd development concepts, practical knowledge in database design, server scripting languages (PHP) and data objects (XML and jSON). Students with little or no technical background will attain a level of proficiency and problem-solving ability that allows them to find junior-level front-end, back-end or fullstack DEV (development) jobs and continue to grow their coding skills.

Students will design, code, and debug programs using Python, a general purpose, cross-platform language with a clear, readable syntax that makes it an ideal introduction to the logic of programing. No prior knowledge of programming is necessary.

DATABASE PROGRAMMING CRS 210

Websites created for a variety of busineses, from medical information to shopping sites, to non-profit organizations manage data and information structured as fields, records and files. The FLSD Graduation Diploma is the first step to achieving a FLS Director Certificate of Fitness, T89 or F89. The diploma is valid for 9 months for the purpose of taking the followup FDNY computer based 'Fire Component' examination. "On-Site" examination must be scheduled with the FDNY.

A FLSD Graduation Diploma will be awarded to those who qualify after successfully completing the three lecture components listed above and taking a final examination for each with a passing score of 70% or better. Some experience in safety and fire prevention, building maintenance, and/or facilities management would be helpful. Questions about your current professional status should be directed to the FDNY.

NON-FIRE EMERGENCY - EAP FSX 090

Weds & Thurs, 6 - 8:30 pm, 2/13 - 2/19 7 hours, \$135

This is the required 7-hour Non-Fire emergency EAP component of the Fire Life Safety Director curriculum. Building safety planners are responsible for developing building evacuation procedures for a variety of non-fire emergencies. The Fire Department requires that applicants for the FLSD Graduation Diploma successfully complete a minimum of seven hours of classroom preparation before taking FDNY's On- Site Examination.

NON-FIRE EMERGENCY ACTIVE SHOOTER - MEP FSX 113

Wed & Thurs, 6 - 8:30 pm, 2/20 - 2/27 4 hours, \$80

This is the required 4-hour Non-Fire Emergency Active Shooter component of the Fire Life Safety Director (FLSD) curricula. The course covers non-fire emergency situations involving active shooters and medical emergencies. The Fire Department requires that applicants for the FLSD Graduation Diploma successfully complete a minimum of four hours of Active Shooter/MEP classroom preparation. After completing the course, candidates will also have to take a FDNY computer-based examination.

BUILDING OPERATION, MAINTENANCE & RECORDKEEPING (BOMR) FSX 012

Sat, 9 am-5 pm, 3/14 7 hours, \$100

This Building Operations, Maintenance and Recordkeeping (BOMR) continuing education course is required of all Refrigerating Systems Operating Engineers (RSOE) who hold the Certificate of Qualification and must complete an application for renewal. Enrollees must bring current certificate card with ID number to class. This is not a beginner's course.

CITYWIDE FIRE GUARD FOR IMPAIRMENT FSX 005

Sat, 10 am - 2 pm, 3/21 4 hours, \$80

Course prepares individuals to take the FDNY's Certificate of Fitness Examination for Fire Guard, F-01. The F-01 Fire Guard replaces the old F-36, F-32 and F-91. This Certificate of Fitness is needed in any occupancy where a required fire protection system (e.g. sprinkler system, fire alarm system and stand- pipe system) is out of service. A fire watch is maintained by one or more persons holding an F-01. For example, Fire Guards are used in some locations like Group B (Office Building) or Group R-1 occupancy (hotel) building and construction sites. This class also includes preparation for the Fire Guard examination for the Certificate of Fitness, F-60: Construction Site & Torch Operations.

FIRE & EMERGENCY DRILL CONDUCTOR FSX 004

Sec B: Sat, 10 am - 2 pm, 3/28 4 hours, \$80

The main purpose of a fire drill is to allow occupants to practice emergency evacuation procedures. The Fire and Emergency Drill Conductor must make sure that fire drills are conducted in a safe and orderly manner. This Preparatory Course will help students pass the FDNY F-07 & W-07 Certificate of Fitness computer-based tests.

SPRINKLER AND STANDPIPE PREPARATORY CLASS FOR FDNY CERTIFICATE OF FITNESS FSX 010

REFRIGERATING SYSTEM OPERATING ENGINEER I ECX 121

This course is designed primarily to assist individuals in preparing for NYC's Refrigerating Machine Operator licensing examination. Minimal laboratory work is involved. It provides lecture and review in the fundamentals of refrigeration equipment. Includes a review of tube and pipe joining, gauges, refrigerant charging, system evacuation and dehydration and analysis of compression of refrigeration cycles.

Note: Knowledge of the field is required. This is not a basic course.

This course is a continuation of Refrigerating System Operating Engineer I, a lecture/review in operating techniques for commercial and industrial air conditioning. Includes review of trouble-shooting, installation procedures, operating techniques for chillers, and appropriate New York City and ASHRAE codes.

Required Prerequisite: ECX 121.

Note: In order to qualify for the 200-hour certificate, both ECX 121 & ECX 122 must be taken at NYC College of Technology.

REFRIGERATION MECHANICS ECX 102

Sat, 8 am - 1 pm, 9/12/20 -3 /20/21 150 hours, \$2150 Textbook purchase required.

A combination laboratory & lecture course in the operation and service of refrigerating equipment. Topics include: soldering, brazing, tube and pipe joining and bending, gauge installation, refrigerant charging, system evacuation and dehydration, and analysis of refrigeration cycle compression. Electrical issues covered include: schematic wiring diagrams, electrical/ mechanical controls, refrigeration systems analysis, and operating sequences.

Prerequisite: Some industry experience preferred but not required. High school level literacy.

FUNDAMENTALS OF HVAC ELECTRICAL CONTROLS ECX 222

Sat, 9am-1 pm, 2/22 - 5/30 50 hours, \$875

This course provides an introduction to electrical controls in both heating and air conditioning systems. It includes: thermostats, relays, transformers, low water cutoff, primary controls, automatic feeders, wiring, and interpreting wire diagrams.

Prerequisite: Some HVAC experience or the permission of the instructor is required.

Security Guard, Electronic Security & Locksmith

8 HOUR PRE-ASSIGNMENT TRAINING COURSE FOR SECURITY GUARDS SOX 090

Sat, 9 am-5 pm, 3/14 8 hours, \$50

This 8-hour course is required by New York State as the first step in obtaining a security guard registration card from the New York Department of State. The course provides the student with a general overview of the duties and responsibilities of a security guard.

16-HOUR ON-THE-JOB TRAINING (OJT) SOX 093

Sat, 9 am - 5 pm, Course Dates TBA 16 hours, \$205

The 16-hour on-the-job program gives an overview of report writing and expands into what was learned in the prerequisite course. Topics include the role of the security guard, electronic fingerprinting, legal powers and limitations, emergency situations, communications and public relations, access control, and ethics and conduct. The passing of an examination is required for successful completion of this course.

8-HOUR ANNUAL IN-SERVICE TRAIN-ING COURSE FOR SECURITY GUARDS SOX 091

This 8-hour course must be completed within 12 calendar months from completion of the 16 hour On-The-Job Training Course for Security Guards, and annually thereafter. The course is structured to provide the student with updated and enhanced information on the duties and responsibilities of a security guard.



ELECTRONIC SECURITY SYSTEMS INSTALLER PROGRAM SOX 095

This course is designed for building maintenance, security personnel, handypersons, hardware specialists and those aspiring to become locksmiths. Students are introduced to locking devices, keys, methods of picking, repairing & servicing locks in both residential and commercial buildings. Types of locks, keys, doors, openers and closers, basic installation of locks, handling emergencies,

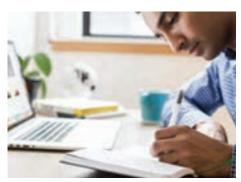
