NOTIFICATION OF DISMISSAL

- Dismissed students are notified of their status through their CUNY First account. Students must be aware of the academic policies in the college catalog that will determine their dismissal.
- The college catalog can be found online at http://www.citytech.cuny.edu/catalog/docs/catalog.pdf
- It is every student's responsibility to check their grades and grade point average (GPA) after each semester and be familiar with the college's policy to determine one's academic status.

REASONS FOR DISMISSAL

1. Failure to attain the required minimum cumulative grade point average

Attempted Credits	Cumulative GPA must be greater than
1 - 12	1.50
12.5 - 24	1.75
over 24.5	2.0

2. Failure to advance from any developmental (remedial or ESOL) class after two attempts.

Students earning their first 18 college credits are eligible for Academic Alert Status prior to advancing to a more severe academic probation status.

APPEALING YOUR DISMISSAL

 Explain your circumstances in your statement and submit supporting documents (if available) to Committee on Course and Standards.

IMPORTANT: APPEAL DEADLINES PLEASE NOTE:

- Students can submit the appeal to the Committee on Course and Standards on or before the deadline (Currently Enrolled vs Non-Enrolled). Please refer to the college academic calendar for appeal submission dates.

Important Points for Writing a Good Dismissal Appeal

State specific reason for dismissal:

- Overall GPA is too low.
- Repeated failure for a Remdial or ESOL class
- Outline your plan to succeed at City Tech :
- Identify the classes you must repeat and the grades you must earn to meet the college standard.
- **Tip**: a grade of C or higher in a repeated class will replace a D, F or WU in the GPA calculation (for up to 16 credits).

Explain and document any unusual circumstances that interfered with your progress, e.g. illness (it is recommended that documentation be supplied in English).

More Important Points

- Document any academic work you have completed at another institution (i.e. transcript from another college).
- Explain what you'd do differently if accepted back to City Tech (study habits, utilizing resources).
- If possible, include a letter of support from a faculty member who knows your academic work.
- Expect to hear back from the committee just before classes start but be aware that many course sections might be closed.
- Expect that if an appeal is granted, you may be required to take only 6-7 credits that semester. Your dismissal status may effect the amount financial aid you receive.

WU APPEALS

• A grade of WU (unofficial withdrawal) has the same weight as an "F" grade on your GPA.

 To appeal grade change of WU to "W" (official withdrawal), check off this option on your appeal form. Submit documents to support.

OPTIONS AFTER DISMISSAL!

- Brooklyn Educational Opportunity Center for remedial classes only.
- Students can't be accepted at BEOC if they have more than 30 credits.
- Applicants must meet income requirements.
- College Language Immersion Program for ESL classes only.
- New Start Program- Kingsborough Community College
- Other CUNY Community College (eligible one full semester after dismissal)
- Apply for Non Degree Enrollment
- Students will not be eligible for financial aid and/or school loans and may not declare a major as a non degree student.

Second Chance does not accept students with remedial needs.

Brooklyn Educational Opportunity Center (BEOC)

Administered by New York City College of Technology CUNY

Low cost program for students dismissed <u>only</u> due to failing a remedial class.

8 & 16 week courses are offered in preparation for CUNY ACT tests in math, reading and writing. Daytime and evening schedules available.

At the completion of this program students who retake the CUNY ACT and pass are readmitted to City Tech if seats are available in their designated major.

No appeal is required once the ACT test is passed, if GPA is above 2.0. This program is not offered in the summer!

BEOC – Who is eligible to attend? 111 Livingston Street (Enter at Boerum Place)

US Citizen or Permanent Resident

Be at least 18 years of age or older

Reside in NY State for at least 1 year

High School or GED Diploma required

Financial need.

To enroll you must reserve an orientation seat. https://www.sunybeoc.org/

*Individuals in good standing at a college or university and four year college graduates are <u>not</u> eligible to attend the BEOC.

NON DEGREE ENROLLMENT

- Students who have been dismissed and do not require remedial coursework may be eligible to attend City Tech as a NON Degree Student. This means you can take the courses required by your Academic Major but not be enrolled in that major. This status is also known as non matriculated. Once your GPA is acceptable, you could request readmission into your major.
- Non Degree students are not eligible for Federal or State financial aid.
- Email <u>ESAR@citytech.cuny.edu</u> and include the reason for applying, any unusual circumstances, all contact information and supporting documentation. Make sure all financial holds on your account have been cleared before requesting non degree status.
