Closing

Conclude by saying thank you to the employer for his/her time and consideration and by making a call to action. Reiterate your interest in the position and highlight how your qualifications and skills make you a great candidate for the position. Politely state that you welcome the opportunity to become a contributing member of the team.

Using AI



It is not **bad** to use AI, but it is bad to use AI **poorly**

- Read what it wrote! Ask yourself "What is being highlighted?"
- Add details about your actual experience

Follow-up responses to AI

"This sounds like it was written by AI, make it sound more like me"

"Here's a project I did [example]. Can you work this in?"

"Give me an outline to complete"

AI Example

"I am particularly drawn to your company's emphasis on building high-quality, scalable systems and believe my passion for well-structured, efficient code aligns with your development principles."

But WHAT is this sentence SAYING?

- I like your company because the systems scale how is this unique?
- I am passionate about clean code is this reason enough to hire someone?



Techniques for AI

Write the first draft yourself - "Can you make this better?"

Make an outline of key points - 1. Opening

- a. Software internship
- b. Junior at City Tech
- c. Like MTA because interested in public service

2. Fullstack project

- a. Robust weather app
 - i. React, Node.js, National Weather Service API
- b. Group project
 - i. team of 3
 - ii. collaboration
- 3. CivicTech Collective project
 - a. Transit companion app
 - i. Real-time updates & stop notifications
 - ii. User testing
- 4. Conclusion

Short Form Questions

Text box for short-form responses **INSTEAD** of cover letter

WHY?

- Answer specific questions
- Unique interest in the company
- Cut down on the fluff



"Why do you want to work here?"

Compelling reasons could be

- Personal connection to the product
- Genuine interest in the mission
- Excitement about technology specific to the company
- Other relevant experience that increased your interest
 - You should be able to think of a reason you want to work somewhere WITHOUT having to use AI
