


Networking Strategies at Events

• Before the Event

- Take a partner, don't go alone
- Research
- Set goals
- Prepare elevator pitch
 - "Hey XXXX, nice to meet you. My name is ARTHUR CHISOLM
 - I'm a junior at City Tech majoring in Computer Systems focused on Networking and Security.
 - I'm really into cybersecurity and just here to check out trends in tech."

Networking Strategies at Events

- During the Event
 - Smile, make eye contact, ask questions
 - Look for someone that looks uncomfortable
 - Approach
 - Collect information
 - Move on



Informational Interviews









Informational Interviews

- What are they?
 - Informal conversations
- How to you find people?
 - Identify contacts through Linkedin
- Prepare Questions
- "Hi XXXX, I'm impressed by your work at [Company] and would love to learn more about your role. Would you be open to a 15-minute chat?"



Informational Interview Questions

Prepare Questions:

- A. What is your work day like?
- B. How did you hear about this field, and get your start?
- C. Please tell me about some of the industry challenges?
- D. Have you noticed any recent trends?
- E. What work challenges keep you up at night?
- F. Can you suggest any books/videos/networking events?
- G. Any suggestions on who else I can contact to learn more about this industry?



Following Up

- Send a thank you note within 1-2 days
 - Mention something you learned
 - Thanking them for sharing insights

Dear Sarah,

Thank you for taking the time to meet with me and provide insight about launching my career as a Software Developer. I particularly appreciated your suggestion to consider [suggestion: book/video or meetup next week] Thanks to our conversation, I now have a better understanding of the the development world, and some great ideas and contacts to pursue.

I'll certainly keep you posted on my progress!





Following Up (con't)

- How do you stay in touch
 - Share articles
 - Updates on your achievements
 - Congratulate them on theirs!



Building Industry Relationships

- Focus on giving, not taking
- Share resources or insights
- Be consistent, but not overbearing
- Attend meetups/events regularly



Job Applying Process - via Informational Interviews

- 1. Find a job on the boards
- 2. Check LinkedIn for connections
- 3. Connect with 3 people at company (no message)
- 4. Add to Job Tracker
- 5. After accepting, send message
 - a. Informational email invite + resume attached
- 6. No response in 3 days Apply to Job
 - a. Also connect with 3 more contacts at the company
- 7. Add to Job tracker
